- Create multimedia digital content across social media platforms based on Adalah's legal and international advocacy work
- Work as part of a new website development team to most effectively integrate social media platforms and outreach
- Monitor, track, analyze and report on performance and audience engagement on social media platforms using tools such as Google Analytics and Facebook insights, and seek increased outreach
- Promote the use of social media outreach within Adalah as part of day-to-day work and through training sessions

- Excellent knowledge of English (spoken and written), knowledge of Arabic and Hebrew a plus
